Statewide Recognition Awarded by America's SBDC Iowa

The NIACC John Pappajohn Entrepreneurial Center and the North Iowa Area Small Business Development Center (SBDC) are proud to announce Matt Curtis of Wayne's Ski & Cycle, Mason City, as the winner of the 2022 Neal Smith Entrepreneur of the Year Award.

The Neal Smith Entrepreneur of the Year Award is presented by America's SBDC Iowa and honors an Iowa entrepreneur who has been in business a minimum of three years and has been significantly assisted by an Iowa Small Business Development Center. The award was established with a dual purpose—to honor longtime Iowa Congressman Neal Smith for his years of service to Iowa's small businesses and to recognize Iowa's entrepreneurs, who are the driving force behind Iowa's economic growth.

Brook Boehmler, Regional Director of the North Iowa Area SBDC, nominated Curtis for the Neal Smith Award, stating, "Matt has worked to keep Wayne's Ski & Cycle nimble and relevant. This has included exploring new business niches, establishing a culture of employee buyin, and moving the business location back to downtown Mason City. Matt is also notable for his support of his fellow entrepreneurs through the Pappajohn Center's entrepreneurial programming and mentorship. Matt's ability to identify and meet the evolving needs of his customers has made Wayne's Ski & Cycle a community mainstay."

Matt Curtis purchased Wayne's Ski & Cycle in 2004. Matt had never thought he'd be an entrepreneur, but when the previous owner approached him about buying the business, Matt realized what a great fit it was. "I followed the dream that I didn't even know I had," he said. "If there's one thing I've learned, it's that you have to take a chance."

The Neal Smith Entrepreneur of the Year Award and the Deb Dalziel Woman Entrepreneurial Award was presented at a ceremony on March 3, 2022, at 7:30 AM in the Legislative Dining Room of the Iowa State Capitol.

Start Smart On Demand

The NIACC Pappajohn Center and the Small Business Development Center offered a free two-hour workshop designed for anyone who is considering starting a business. At Start Smart, participants learn how to create a business plan, conduct market research, discuss different types of business ownership, and learn how to register a business. North Iowa entrepreneurs can now participate in Start Smart on their own schedule with On Demand Training through America's SBDC Iowa.

The Start Smart sessions have been recorded and divided into 6 parts, so you can watch them when it is convenient for you. There will be short tests at the end of each session to ensure you understand the basic concepts. Spring Venture School Launch Day

The NIACC John Pappajohn Entrepreneurial Center hosted Venture School Launch Day on Thursday, March 24, 2022. The Spring 2022 Venture School cohort competed in person after attending classes virtually for 7 weeks of training, customer discovery, and developing their business model alongside local entrepreneur coaches. A panel of judges [Matt Curtis, Wayne's Ski & Cycle; Megan Peterson, MP Home Design; Jeff Potts, 2020 Creative LLC; and Katie Wold, Three on the Tree] selected First, Second, and Third Place winners, and one Honorable Mention award.

First Place - Dr. Tara Nichols DNP, Maters of Comfort© Private Practice, Mason City IA. Awarded \$1,500 prize.

Second Place - Josh Jeske, Terraform Tillage, Eldora IA. Awarded \$1000 prize.

Third Place - Sadie Yunek, The Ruff Life of Pets, Mason City IA. Awarded \$500 prize.

Honorable Mention - Grant Maulsby, Boxx Scaffolding, Clear Lake IA. Awarded \$250 prize.

The University of Iowa Venture School is a premier statewide program for entrepreneurs and is built from a streamlined curriculum developed by the National Science Foundation I-Corps at Stanford University and the University of California, Berkeley. Venture School emphasizes real-world entrepreneurship and innovation based on leading edge curriculum. Teams will accelerate the startup process by testing their business model hypotheses immediately. They get out of the building to talk to customers, partners, and competitors, rather than relying on statistics and secondhand market research.

Each team is assigned a local entrepreneur as their coach. On Launch Day, participants compete for seed money with the top team winning \$1,500. In addition, eligible teams may compete for cash awards at the state level during the Venture School Launch Day at EntreFEST in Iowa City on June 9-10, 2022. The cost for the course is \$299. Applications Now Open for the Annual John Pappajohn Iowa Entrepreneurial Venture Competition

The 2022 John Pappajohn Iowa Entrepreneurial Venture Competition application portal is now open. The seventeenth annual statewide competition will award \$100,000 in cash prizes to Iowa startups and entrepreneurial ventures.

The \$100,000 in seed funding includes a \$50,000 contribution from John and Mary Pappajohn, matched by \$50,000 from the lowa Economic Development Authority (IEDA). The goal of this competition is to support lowa's entrepreneurial ecosystem by assisting entrepreneurs.

Iowa businesses that have been in operation for four years or less, or are not yet cash-flow positive, are eligible to apply. This competition is open to businesses including, but not limited to, technology, biotechnology, green technologies, medical, advanced manufacturing, agriculture, engineering, and education industries.

The deadline for first-round submissions is May 16, second-round submissions for select applicants is July 18, with final awards announced on September 15, 2022.

Participants will be judged first on their written submissions on the YouNoodle. com platform. Those who advance to the final round of the competition, will give a formal presentation to a panel of judges. First place will be awarded

\$40,000, second place \$25,000, and third place \$15,000. Awards for other honorable mention categories will total up to \$20,000.

The competition is a collaborative project of the Iowa John Pappajohn Entrepreneurial Centers located at Drake University, Iowa State University, North Iowa Area Community College, the University of Iowa, and the University of Northern Iowa. The Iowa Economic Development Authority provides funding to bring the total prize package to \$100,000.


