## A Culture of Entrepreneurship

This past year we have seen a resurgence of business and tourism activity in North Iowa, which is so encouraging and demonstrates how resilient our communities are, even in the face of continued uncertainty. As we closed our fiscal year on June 30th, I thought about how grateful I am for all the wonderful community partners, stakeholders, and collaborators, and I sincerely thank you. I can think of nothing more important than collaboration and cooperation to help build a strong culture of entrepreneurship in North Iowa. We continue to engage in collaborative initiatives that can have a profound effect in North Iowa and further our center's vision to serve as the primary source for entrepreneurship education programs, small business counseling/ support services, and as a liaison to additional resources.

Forward momentum is on our side. It's been an exciting year to be in North Iowa. We've had many reasons to celebrate this past year, including awards, anniversaries, and entrepreneur and small business successes. Here are some of the highlights:

- NIACC was announced one of 25 semifinalists for the prestigious Aspen Institute College Excellence in Education awards, from over 150 applicants nationwide
- NIACC was selected as a 2022 Northern Iowa "Employer of Choice" Award
- Almost \$70,000 in seed money awards went to Pappajohn Center students and startups in local and state competitions
- Matt Curtis of Wayne's Ski & Sports won the coveted Iowa SBDC 2022 Neal Smith Entrepreneur of the Year award
- 25th Anniversary statewide celebration of the five John Pappajohn Entrepreneurial Centers
- 40th Anniversary celebration of America's SBDC Iowa

- North Iowa Corridor 2022 TAI Technology Community of Year Award Finalist
- North Iowa chambers won community excellence awards, tourism awards, community marketing awards
- IEDA, housing, tourism and catalysts grants awarded all across North Iowa
- RAGBRAI traveled across northern lowa and got a firsthand look at the hospitality and all that North Iowa has to offer when they overnighted in Mason City and Charles City the last week of July
- Pappajohn Entrepreneurial Center, in collaboration with NIACC Continuing Education, awarded a USDA RBDG Grant for \$51,000 to scale the Innovation Workspace and serve more North Iowa businesses
- Pappajohn Entrepreneurial Center was awarded a TeamQuest grant to be used to further STEM education
- NewBoCo out of Cedar Rapids was awarded a \$100,000 grant to pilot work with the Pappajohn Entrepreneurial Center and Mt. Pleasant to bring Delta V Code School and an Accelerator Program to rural North Iowa

The Pappajohn Center increased the five-year business survival rate from 86% to 89%! There is no one-size-fits all solution for the clients we serve. The path is different for each one and there is not always a prescriptive process. ## NIACC Pappajohn Entrepreneurial Center Hosts Youth Entrepreneurial Academy

The NIACC John Pappajohn Entrepreneurial Center conducted the Youth Entrepreneurial Academy on June 13-17 sponsored by the John K. and Luise V. Hanson Foundation. The academy is offered annually and free to all high school students interested in entrepreneurship. Participants receive a \$500 NIACC scholarship sponsored by John Pappajohn. This year's academy included 5 high school students. The aspiring entrepreneurs completed the academy which is held as a day camp from 8:30am-4:00pm.

Throughout the entire week, the young entrepreneurs worked diligently to progress a business model canvas. Students had the opportunity to network with local entrepreneurs, develop leadership skills, and gain fundamental skills required when starting a business. Tuesday, June 22, the students pitched their business ideas by submitting an executive summary that included a company description, financial plans, and business model key measures that included startup costs and sales projections. Additionally, five students received a \$500 seed money award for the businesses they developed during the week.

The Academy's director and mentor was Kelley O'Rourke, School Partnership Entrepreneurial Coordinator at the Pappajohn Center. The facilitator was Candi Karsjens, Pappajohn Center Director, and Tom Moore, Director of Innovation and Acceleration at the Pappajohn Center. Mentors included: Camille Urban, retired patent attorney and consultant; Madelyn Kollasch, YEA Alum, Newman Catholic graduate, NIACC student, and CEO Club President.

Guest speakers for the week were Tyler Anderson, Roller City and Tropical Sno owner; Brook Boehmler, North Iowa Area SBDC Regional Director; Joyce Martin, Pappajohn Center Marketing and Communications Coordinator and Brad and Angie Barber, Cabin Coffee founders and Franchise owners. The students presented their businesses to a panel of three judges: Hunter Callanan, North Iowa Corridor Economic Development Corporation; Jeff Potts, 20/20 Creative; and Beth Bilyeu, Forest City Economic Development Corporation.

The judges chose three businesses to win an additional **\$500** seed money award and two honorable mention prizes of **\$250**. The winners were:

## North Iowa Entrepreneurs Take Home Wins from 2022 Venture School Pitch Competition

Three North Iowa entrepreneurs took home wins from the 2022 University of Iowa Venture School Launch Day which was held Thursday, June 9, 2022. Five finalists from across the state of Iowa competed in the pitch competition, held at EntreFEST, a two-day entrepreneurial conference held in Iowa City, IA. This year, three of the five finalists were graduates of the North Iowa Venture School program hosted by the NIACC Pappajohn Center. Billie Asmus of Silicone Studios (Hampton, IA) won the Third Place prize of \$5,000. Dr. Tara Nichols of Maters of Comfort (Mason City, IA) and Josh Jeske of TerraForm Tillage (Eldora, IA) each took home an Honorable Mention prize of \$1,500.

All three entrepreneurs are graduates of the Venture School program at the NIACC John Pappajohn Entrepreneurial Center. The NIACC Pappajohn Center Venture School class is led by Candi Karsjens, Director of the Pappajohn Center and certified NSF i-Corps instructor. Candi Karsjens, Director of the NIACC Pappajohn Center, said, "EntreFEST is such a great culminating event to celebrate the best Venture School graduates and really celebrates the spirit and culture of entrepreneurship in Iowa. Our participants did a fantastic job pitching their business ideas and representing North Iowa and the

culture of entrepreneurship of our region." North Iowa entrepreneurs continue to perform well at the statewide competition.

In 2020, Jayson Ryner of ReEnvision Ag took home First Place. In 2021, Zach Smith of The Stock Cropper took home First Place, and Nate Julseth of Nate's Powder Coating took home First Runner-Up.

## John Pappajohn Iowa Entrepreneurial Venture Competition Awards \$100,000 in Cash Prizes

The sixteenth annual John Pappajohn Iowa Entrepreneurial Venture Competition awarded \$100,000 in cash prizes to nine Iowa ventures Friday, August 12. The \$100,000 in seed funding consists of a \$50,000 contribution from John Pappajohn and a \$50,000 match from the Iowa Economic Development Authority (IEDA). The goal of this competition is to support Iowa's entrepreneurial eco system.

Iowa businesses that have been in operation for four years or less or are not yet cash flow positive were eligible to apply. The competition is open to businesses including, but not limited to, technology, biotechnology, green technologies, medical, advanced manufacturing, agriculture, engineering and education industries.

Participants were judged on written submissions, and those who advanced to the final round of the competition presented to a panel of judges. Three of our clients were awarded seed money: First place winner, Michael Hora of Continum Ag, received \$40,000, Jayson Ryner of ReEnvision Ag Inc. (\$5,000) and Jill Ihrke of Easy2Show (\$2,000) received honorable mention honors. All three teams have worked with the NIACC Pappajohn Center and participated in entrepreneur programs geared for start-ups.

## **NIACC Students Earn Seed Money State Pitch Competition**

The Pappajohn Student Entrepreneurial Venture Competition, sponsored by John Pappajohn, Equity Dynamics, Inc., awarded three \$5,000 awards to Zemira (University of Northern Iowa), Farm Story Meats (Iowa State University), and F-X Systems, Inc. (University of Iowa).

A total of 15 student businesses competed as regional finalists selected from each of the five John Pappajohn Entrepreneurial Centers: Iowa State University, University of Northern Iowa, North Iowa Area Community College, University of Iowa, and Drake University. Each regional finalist was awarded \$500 if not selected for the top award. The competition is held every spring and is open to Iowa university and college students, including private and community colleges, with an interest in starting their own business. Students from the NIACC Pappajohn Center in Mason City competed at a regional competition on April 6, 2022, at NIACC. They were awarded \$500 for their business concepts.

This year's Verizon Innovative Learning STEM Achievers camp brought 34 middle school students to campus this summer to learn about emerging technology, social entrepreneurship, and design thinking. During this fourweek camp, students participated in three different topic sessions: Artificial Intelligence and Robotics, where the students began to code, Immersive Media, focusing on augmented and virtual reality, and Digital Product Innovations, with computer-aided design and 3D printing. Some students take great joy in coding their robotics to follow intricate paths through the classroom and respond to colors on the floor. ## NewBoCo Partnership

The Pappajohn Center is happy to announce that Cedar Rapids will no longer be the only home for NewBoCo programs in Iowa, as the nonprofit is launching its Community Partner Pilot program in Mount Pleasant and Mason City. The recent \$100,000 grant from Iowa Economic Development Authority that NewBoCo received will jump-start the pilot program, which will support communities in strengthening their innovation ecosystem without having to start new programs from scratch. With this new partnership, we have the ability to develop an end-to-end programming framework for scalable entrepreneurship and innovation that is both accessible and inclusive and improves the lives of all residents of our region.

The first two programs to be offered through the Pappajohn Center in collaboration with the NIACC Continuing Ed and

Economic Development division is the DeltaV Code School and a customized accelerator program in collaboration





with the Iowa Startup Accelerator for early-stage startups. DeltaV is Iowa's premier coding and network administration technical school using tested curriculum developed by NewBoCo and Code Fellows of Seattle, WA.
